

- Unusually loud talking or laughing shall not be tolerated.
- No drinking or eating shall be allowed on the bus.
- Obscene language will not be tolerated.
- The use of tobacco in any form will not be permitted while riding the bus.
- Band instruments too large to be placed under the seat may not be transported.
- The bus shall not be defaced in any manner. A student defacing a bus shall be required to reimburse the school district for the cost of repairs.
- Student may be put off the bus only at his/her school by the principal acting on the bus misconduct report.
- The bus driver and the coordinator of transportation shall determine all bus stops.
- Requests to ride an alternate bus must be made through the Transportation Department. Only emergency requests will be approved.

Cafeteria Regulations

- Students are not allowed in the cafeteria except during their regular lunch period and from 7 a.m. to 7:25 a.m. in the morning.
- Students are not allowed to take food or drinks outside the eating areas.
- Students should remain in the eating areas for the entire lunch period.
- Shouting or "horseplay" of any type will not be allowed.
- Students are expected to pick up after themselves.
- Loitering around the vending machines will not be allowed.

Fighting

Students who encourage and / or watch others who fight may also be disciplined at the administrator's discretion.

Food and Drink in Classrooms

No food or drink will be allowed in the classroom without teacher permission.

Glass Containers

Glass containers are not allowed on campus or parking lots. Students who bring their lunch to school are allowed to bring thermos containers or canned drinks.

Leaving School for Related Activities

Students at school for related activities (plays, games, dances, etc.) are prohibited from going to the parking lot, leaving school grounds or events without permission of school personnel unless leaving the activity completely.

Locks on Lockers - Annex Building

School lockers are school property but the students are allowed to place locks on their lockers to protect their books and valuables. If a lock is chosen which uses a key, it is suggested that a duplicate key be left with the appropriate assistant principal tagged with the student's name and locker number. If a combination lock is chosen, it is suggested that a copy of the combination be left with the appropriate assistant principal. Administration feels that the lock that uses a key is the safer of the two.

Use your own locker; do not use other lockers as they are subject to assignment at any time. Valuables are not to be brought to school. Any loss of such is the student's responsibility.

Mediation

Conroe High School will offer a team mediation program that provides students and staff a measure of non-violent conflict resolution to be used for disputes that arise in the school setting.

Parking Regulations

Students are allowed to use their own transportation to and from school but the school is not responsible for damage or losses to vehicles or accidents, which occur on the school parking lots.

All students driving cars or motorcycles to school must register them with the officer on duty. To register you must give license plate numbers and show a valid driver's license. You will not be allowed

to park on campus without a school-parking permit. These permits are \$30 per school year.

The speed limit in all parking lots is 5 m.p.h.

Students involved in extracurricular activities are not considered early release.

All accidents or thefts in the parking area should be reported to the appropriate assistant principal and police officer.

Failure to comply with the above regulations may result in your parking privileges being revoked or disciplinary action. Fire lanes must remain open. The police officers may take suitable action to maintain the fire lanes.

All persons picking up students should come to the front of the school building on Highway 105 to eliminate congestion in the bus loading area on Wilson Road. Please observe the Exit Only signs at the front of Conroe High School.

Vehicles may be towed if they are blocking any area or are not parked properly within the defined student parking area.

- All students driving motor vehicles to school must obtain a parking permit. See your assistant principal or police officer for details.
- Students driving vehicles other than the one with a parking sticker should contact campus police for a temporary parking permit.
- Students may not park in areas or spaces designated for school employees. This includes the area around trash dumpsters, fire lanes, or gates.
- Students may not park in front of the school before leaving for a late school activity.
- Students may not loiter either in cars or the parking lot at any time.
- Students who must return to their vehicle during the school day must obtain a pass from the assistant principal.
- Any student needing to leave campus during school must obtain a permit to leave campus from the assistant principal or attendance office.

- All accidents, thefts, or other problems should be reported to the appropriate assistant principal or campus security.
- No student will be allowed to park on the Conroe High School campus after August 17, 2001 without obtaining a parking permit.
- If a student violates the attendance laws by leaving campus or taking other students off campus, he / she may lose parking privileges.
- The first parking violation will result in a warning and a review of parking rules and regulations, which the student will sign. The second offense will result in a 10-day suspension of parking privileges. A third violation may result in the loss of parking privileges for the rest of the semester and the vehicle will be booted. Removal of the boot will cost \$10.00. Any further offenses may result in towing / booting of the car and permanent loss of parking privileges. Towing / booting of cars will be at owner's expense. A violation for parking in a handicap space, fire lane or any violation covered by Texas Law will result in a Conroe Independent School District Police Department ticket and a two-week parking suspension the first time. The second offense will result in a permanent loss of parking privileges and vehicle will be towed at the owner's expense.
- The student and an administrator will sign all forms, including the Two-week Suspension Form and the permanent Loss of Parking Privileges Form.

Pep Rally / Activity Schedule

Pep rallies may be scheduled.

Tobacco, Alcohol, and Drug Use

Cars and lockers may be searched for tobacco, alcohol, and drugs in accordance with Board Policy FNF. The non-prescription drug Vivarin or any similar type stimulants are specifically prohibited from campus. Students possessing or using such drugs will receive disciplinary action. Any student in possession of and / or use of any substance identified by law enforcement agencies as a substance that is or has been used as a drug to illicit a behavioral change may result in disciplinary action.
